



Cost-Savings

In addition to some of the most well-known ways Mexico helps you minimize costs, such as its affordable labor force, logistics savings, and variety of trade agreements that allow companies to reduce tariffs and import-export taxes, there are several programs, certifications, and incentives that must also play a crucial role in any company's expansion plan. In addition to the savings below, you can also save on the raw materials, supplies and services required by your business by working with a trusted supplier of shelter services and gaining access to their economies of scale.

IMMEX

(Program of Manufacturing Industry, Maquila and Export Services). This program provides benefits to qualifying investors, such as saving on import duties on products that are subsequently exported, providing significant savings for companies manufacturing in Mexico.

Some of the program's specific benefits include:



- Deferred payment of import duties for up to 18 months (can be extended to 36 months under the OEA program)
- Ability to apply for IVA/IEPS certification to credit VAT on temporary imports.

IVA/IEPS

(VAT Certification/and Special Tax on Products and Services) Combined with the IMMEX program, the VAT certification program allows companies to receive full credit for VAT import taxes. Though it can take up to one year to obtain both certifications, it allows companies to import materials and machinery completely exempt from VAT.

IVA/IEPS

These programs will allow your company to take full advantage of the cost savings available to companies manufacturing in Mexico. PROSEC

(Sectorial Promotion Program) This program allows companies to import raw materials to be used for the production of goods in the 24 specific sectors covered in the program, including automotive, textiles and electronics, among others, at preferential ad valorem tariff rates (General Import Tax). PROSEC applies to imported to be used goods production of specific products, regardless of if these are destined for domestic consumption export markets.

THE 8TH RULE

Companies that are registered in the PROSEC program can apply for an additional permit under the 8th Rule which allows them to import machinery and equipment, materials, parts, and components that will be used for a specific project for products to be manufactured or assembled in the country, exempt from import duties.

This allows for a variety of options for transporting goods depending on what best meets your needs. The flexibility of having multiple options, and the transparency of being able to communicate with transport carriers and track shipments in real time further reduces logistics risks.

In addition, Mexico's shared time zones, geographic location in North America neighboring one of the world's largest consumer markets, similar business cultures, and widespread use of English in business, facilitates effective communication, allows for prompt responses to consumer behavior changes, provides the ability to carry out proper due diligence, and have more control over your entire supply chain.



Additionally, Mexico's Authorized Economic Operators (OEA) certification helps further reduce risk and streamlines cross-border shipping for U.S. companies manufacturing in Mexico and international companies engaging in cross-country shipping. This program, which is promoted by the World Customs Organization, is aimed at increasing supply chain visibility and security and is Mexico's equivalent of the C-TPAT certification granted by the U.S. Customs and Border Protection. In addition to its tax savings, Mexico's IMMEX program allows companies to apply for additional incentives that grant flexibility in import and export processes with authorities that reduce the risk of non-compliance and penalties.



When manufacturing is switched to Mexico, it brings valuable benefits essential for risk reduction in logistics and production.



4. Robust Manufacturing Bases

Mexico's manufacturing industry has long been a significant contributor to the country's economy, resulting in well-developed supply chains servicing various sectors.

The automotive industry is a prime example of Mexico's manufacturing prowess. As the largest supplier of auto parts to the United States, the fourth-largest exporter of vehicles globally, and home to 21 of the world's leading automakers and over 600 tier-one suppliers, Mexico has well-developed supply chains with a wide range of processing capabilities across the country. This has created synergy and cross-development with other sectors with shared processes and capabilities, such as the electronics, aviation, aerospace, and home appliance industries.




